1. One Body, One Spirit, One Hope

A. One Body — We Belong to Each Other

“There is one **body**, and one Spirit...”

“So we, who are many, are one **body** in Christ, and individually members one of another.” — Romans 12:5

We must learn to love, serve, forgive, and bear with one another because we are **body**.

B. One Spirit — God Lives Within Us

“There is one body, and one Spirit...”

If everyone is inhabited by the same Spirit, they effectively become a
“New Humanity”

1. One Body, One Spirit, One Hope

C. One Hope — Our Future is Secure

“just as also you were called in one **hope** of your calling..”

The one **hope** is the certain promise that because we belong to Christ, our future is secure — from forgiveness today to glory forever.

2. One Lord, One Faith, One Baptism

A. One Lord — Jesus Christ Reigns

“one Lord, one faith, one baptism”

Is Christ truly ‘One Lord’ of your decisions, priorities, and desires?

2. One Lord, One Faith, One Baptism

B. One Faith - One Gospel

“one Lord, one faith, one baptism”

'so that we are no longer to be children, tossed here and there by waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by the trickery of men, by craftiness in deceitful scheming, '

Ephesians 4:14

"One faith" is the shared conviction that defines the identity of the group.

2. One Lord, One Faith, One Baptism

C. One **Baptism** - Public Identification with Christ

“one Lord, one faith, one **baptism**”

You belong to Jesus.. Now live daily in the reality of your new identity in Christ.

3. One God and Father

A. God is Sovereign — Over All

“one **God** and Father of all who is over all and through all and in all.”

Trust **God** is in Control, even when life feels chaotic
